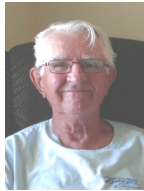

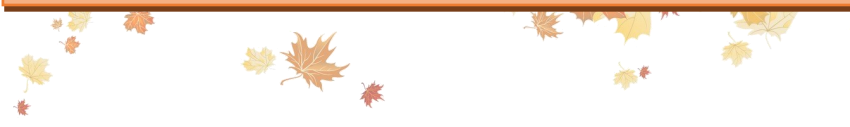

# HEAL

## THE LORD GOD, OUR HEALER

There are many names in the Bible that God uses to describe Himself, of His character and attributes. One in particular I am thankful for is Jehovah Rapha (The LORD Who Heals). The Blue Letter Bible defines Rapha as “to restore”, “to heal” or “to make healthful”. It also states that “Jehovah is the Great Physician who heals the physical and emotional needs of His people. In Greek, Jehovah Rapha is translated as “the Lord your healer.”

David wrote in Psalm 139:13, “For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother’s womb.” And in Psalm 139:15 & 16 “My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place. When I was woven together in the depths of the earth, your eyes saw my unformed body.” Another psalmist writes in Psalm 119:73, “Your hands made me and formed me;”

These men without the knowledge that we have today through medicine and science realized the intricate design and resilience with which God created us and they marveled over it. We have today through the vast knowledge of medicine and of how our bodies function to appreciate to even a greater degree the words of David in Psalm 139:14, “I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well.”

We know God designed us with an immune system to fight off viruses, bacteria and toxins. It also restores our injuries and infected areas back to health. When we have a cut

and it bleeds the blood vessels contract and slow down bleeding. The platelet cells in the blood show up to clot, stop the bleeding and start healing. The white blood cells come along to fight off infection and control inflammation. This is how our Creator designed us.

While being my mother’s caretaker, there was a day when she passed out and fell down the steps in the house. Catching her arm on the banister, she ripped the skin of her inside forearm down to the dermis, which is right below the epidermis, our top layer of skin. The tear was over an inch wide and ran the length of her arm. Using a special gel, sterile water, adaptic dressings and bandages daily for a month, we watched amazed as the skin slowly began to heal and grow back together from the outer edges inward, to close completely.

God told the Israelites in Exodus 15:26 (in part), “I am the Lord, who heals you.” In Psalm 103, David praises the LORD for “all his benefits” one being in verse 3, “who forgives all your sins and heals all your diseases.” And He heals our emotions too - Psalm 147:3, “He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds.” He does not ignore the cry of His children. Psalm 30:2, “O LORD my God, I called to you for help and you healed me.”

How great is our God, so comforting and assuring. He not only created us and sustains us but He also promises to heal us.

### HEALTHY APPLE-WALNUT MUFFINS

Made with no added fat or sugar, these tasty muffins use fruit and buttermilk to keep them moist.

Makes 12 muffins -15 minutes preparation, 25 minutes baking

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/4 teaspoon ground allspice
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/4 rounded teaspoon salt
- 2 large eggs
- 1 cup plus 2 tablespoons frozen, tawed apple juice concentrate
- 2/3 cup buttermilk
- 2 tablespoons oat bran
- 2 small Granny Smith apples, peeled, cored, and chopped
- 1/3 cup chopped walnuts (about 1-1/3 ounces)
- 1 small Granny Smith apple, peeled, cored, and cut into 12 thin slices



- 1 Preheat oven to 375 degrees f. Grease 12 standard size muffin pan cups or line with paper liners.
- 2 Mix together flour, baking soda, cinnamon, ginger, all-spice, nutmeg, and salt.
- 3 Mix together eggs, apple juice, and buttermilk.
- 4 Stir flour mixture and oat bran into egg mixture until dry ingredients are just moistened. Do not overmix. Gently stir in chipped apples and nuts.
- 5 Spoon batter into prepared pan, filling cups two-thirds full. Garnish each muffin with an apple slice.
- 6 Bake muffins until lightly golden and tops spring back when pressed, 25 minutes. Transfer pan to a wire rack to cool slightly. Turn muffins out onto rack to cool completely.

**Baking Tips:** Instead of frozen apple juice concentrate, use other bottled fruit juice concentrates. Health food stores generally carry the best variety. Experiment with papaya, pineapple, and mango.
